

**Patrick J. Mahaffy**

President and Chief Executive Officer; Director  
Clovis Oncology

Mr. Mahaffy is a founder of Clovis Oncology and has served as President and Chief Executive Officer and a member of the board of directors since its inception. Previously, Mr. Mahaffy served in the same role at Pharmion Corporation, which he founded in 2000 and sold to Celgene Corporation in 2008. From 1992 through 1998, Mr. Mahaffy was President and Chief Executive Officer of NeXagen, Inc. and its successor, NeXstar Pharmaceuticals, Inc., a biopharmaceutical company. Prior to that, Mr. Mahaffy was a Vice President at E.M. Warburg Pincus and Co. Mr. Mahaffy also serves on the boards of directors of Orexigen Therapeutics, Inc., and Flexion Therapeutics, Inc. He is a trustee of Lewis and Clark College. Mr. Mahaffy has a B.A. in international affairs from Lewis and Clark College and a M.A. in international affairs from Columbia University.



The Mahaffy Clovis Cache was found on Mr. Mahaffy's property by a landscaper in May 2008. The Cache, found at a depth of approximately 18 inches, was analyzed and found to have blood residue of camels and horses which roamed the area prior to their extinction over 13,000 years ago. One of the tools in the Cache is the first Clovis artifact to test positive for residue of sheep, and another tested positive for bear. Much of the material used to craft the tools in the Cache originated from Colorado's Western Slope and perhaps as far north as southern Wyoming. The stone appears to have come from at least four distinct regions, including sites in Colorado's Middle Park south of Steamboat Springs.
